



May 7th through the 12th we had a group of fly fishermen go to the Pitt River to try the streams and lakes up near Burney. **Don Mittelsteadt** of Branch 34 led this effort. Rushing water in the streams and high water (to overflowing) in the reservoirs made fishing tricky. Hat Creek was ok, but Baum Lake and Lake Margaret proved to be the best fishing. Nonetheless, they managed to bring home several good-sized fish and enjoyed great fellowship along the way.

As of this writing, the next planned trip will be to Lake Almanor (near Chester) for trout on May 21-25. **Craig Walton** is the Fishmaster. Eleven of our members will be attending. 
