Area 2 Fishing Report

The Delta has proven fickle again, what with the hot weather and, more importantly, the hot water that's kept the stripers and salmon down in the Bay. The few boats that have gone out have reported only shakers (below limit stripers) and an "occasional" salmon. Branch 8's **Craig Walton** and Joe **Peterson** of Branch 19 have gone out several times. The last trip (September 19th) to Sherman Lake and Buoy 12 did produce a couple of keeper stripers, so there will be something to Bar-B-Q. Branch 8's **Bill Hooy** and **Karl Drosse** (in-waiting for 171) also went out on the 19th and got a bunch of shakers and a couple of cats. In fact, one of the cats bit Karl on the finger hard enough to really hurt. The good news is that the water is getting progressively colder and that will bring in the fish.

In line with that, the California Striped Bass Association is having its annual salmon derby at Viera's Resort near Isleton on the weekend of September 25th. Should be a good turnout, even though the timing seems about 2 weeks early.

Four fishermen from our Area 2 Group, led by Branch 146's **John Wall**, went trout fishing in the Eastern Sierra (Bridgeport). Most are fly fishermen, and so, the trip will involve mostly stream but some lake fishing. Weather has been good, so reports should be upbeat when they return in late September.

As far as fishing for the next three months, the Group plans:

- Trips to Viera's (near Isleton) for stripers/salmon;
- Day trips to the Delta for stripers/salmon (as arranged with boat owners over the balance of September, October and November);
- Day trips out the Golden Gate for salmon (dates open – depends upon fishing – **Ed Dijkman** is Fishmaster);
- Trip to Lake Davis for pike/trout (October 1 to 4 – **Joe Karg** is Fishmaster);

- CSBA/Haps Fishing Seminar in Rio Vista (September 30 – a must for those wanting to fish the Delta this Fall);
- Trip to Eagle Lake for trout (October 22-27 – **Craig Walton** is Fishmaster);
- Trip to Oregon for salmon (date is open – depends on fishing – **Ed Dijkman** is Fishmaster);
- Trip to Klamath for steelhead (dates are open – **John Wall** is Fishmaster).

There's much more to come, so, "if you're not fishing, you're not trying".

FRED KOVAR will speak to us at our Monday, October 16 meeting about the “Lawrence Livermore National Lab: Its Founding, Research and Development Pro-grams, and Military Applications.”

His impressive academic credentials include a B.S. from John Carroll University, and a Masters and Ph.D. in physics from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri. Fred also taught physics for three years at St. Bonaventure in New York State.

Fred worked at the Lawrence Livermore National Lab for 30 years, primarily in nuclear weapon design, and liaison with the Air Force and Navy on advanced weapon programs. He also worked in magnetic fusion, nuclear waste management, and non-proliferation at the lab, as well as a member of the Nuclear Emergency Response team. He served for two years in the Pentagon as Special Science Advisor to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Atomic Energy.

Fred retired in 1993 and taught physics at Diablo Valley College until 2002.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, Fred is a member and former Big Sir of SIR Branch 146 in Pleasant Hill.
