

## Annual Voluntary Contribution Will Be Reinstated at June Luncheon

The Branch 116 budget was adopted unanimously at the April Executive Committee meeting, and the Annual Voluntary Contribution was reinstated at \$15. It had been suspended in 2005 and 2006 to reduce our cash assets, and did so successfully. AVC funds received are used to pay all 116 expenses (state dues, postage, printing, etc.) except the luncheon caterer and hall rental. A \$1 increase in the lunch charge, also effective June 1, to \$15 was approved to cover increased luncheon costs.




## Attendance

The next meeting will be June 28th, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill, Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. The meeting starts at 8:30 am. May was a busy month for Sir's fisherman.

**Joe Karg** led a group on a houseboat outing to Lake Shasta early in the month. Romano Gnusti, **Bill Hooy**, **Karl Droese**, **Terry Miller**, and **John Hayes** enjoyed great weather on the three day trip catching a total of 17 rainbow trout. **Romano Gnusti** had the high score with 10 fish.

**Don Mittelstaedt** was fish-master on a varied location fly fishing trip starting on the Pitt River. Joining Don were **Craig Walton**, **Jim Andrews**,

and **Harry Sherinian**. The Pitt river was not too productive, so they tried Duncan Lake where they enjoyed a strong morning bite, but little after that; then on to Hat Creek where **Jim Andrews** and **Harry Sherinian** did well. Fishing was slow at Baum Lake, but Iron Canyon Reservoir treated them better. The finale at Lake Margaret was productive for everyone, but the fish were all small. The weather was cool but pleasant, and the food and camaraderie were outstanding. **Joe Peterson** fished with **Craig Walton** and **Carl Moyer** on a day in the delta that was unproductive, a day on Sherman Lake with Carl Moyer for one striper, a day up the delta with Carl for one striper, and a day on San Pablo bay for some leopard sharks. The delta was a real bust this year with only a few stripers caught. Carl Moyer caught a Dorado fishing in Cozumel, Mexico, 2 salmon 8 to 10 pounds fishing out of Half Moon Bay, and a shaker halibut fishing the south bay. The wind continues to be a negative factor for us, with no calm in sight. **Jack Waddell**

caught several nice rainbow trout fishing in San Pablo reservoir with his son. **Al Brunner** fished with **Barry Canevero**, a Delta guide, in the delta by Horse Shoe Bend trolling for 12 stripers from 20 inches to 27 pounds on May 14th. Most of the fish were released, the wind was not a factor on this day.

Upcoming adventures are: June 13, a social at an English Pub; June 25 through 27, fly fishing for trout on the lower Sacramento, June 18 through 22, Norden/Soda Springs for trout.

The salmon season opened on April 7. The size limit is 20 inches, limit of 2 fish. When the wind eases, the fishing has been very good, and a lot of 20 to 30 pound fish have been caught. It looks like a good year. Ocean rockfishing season opens June 1. Size limits include 24 inches for Ling Cod, and 16 inches for Cabezon.




