The lunch / bridge group met on November 11th at Round Hill C.C. with 26 men attending. This was a high scoring day with Warren Westrup taking top honors with 7,400 points. In second place with 6,540 points was Dick Chaffee, followed by Joel White (6,470) and Bill Sullivan (6,220). A grand slam was bid and made by Bill Sullivan / Fred Massaro (only the second grand slam this year!). Small slams were made by Warren Westrup / Ben Yeraka, Joel White / Ron Wohlberg, Fred Massaro / Ron Wolberg, Warren Westrup / Jack Butler and Jai Yee / Darrell Fey.

The lunch / bridge group met again on November 25th with 28 men attending. This day was a much lower scoring day, coming in with an average score fore the day of 3,635 points. High scorer was Jack Butler with 5,810 points. Tied for second place was Bob Wolf and Milt Greenstein, with Ali Aghaie-pour (5,080) just barely edging out Bob Daily (5,070) for fourth place money. No slams were made today, as if to even out for the barrage of slams we had on November 11th.

This was our final session for 2008. Our overall scoring champion for 2008 was Ali Aghaiepour with an average session score of 5,012 points (17 sessions), followed by Milt Greenstein (average 4,626 points, 17 sessions) and Jai Yee (average 4,604 points, 17 sessions). To qualify for this position, a player had to play in at least 15 sessions. Overall total scorer for the year was Jack Butler, who amassed 85,270 points in 21 sessions (a perfect attendance record!).

## Nine Hole Info Dick Chaffee, 9-Hole Chairman



This month we will again hold our <u>9 Hole Golf</u> Championship Tournament (see schedule below). The Tournament will be 3 rounds of golf. One round at each of the courses we play. The Tournament Champion will be the golfer with lowest <u>net</u> total for <u>2</u> rounds. If a participant plays all 3 rounds, he can choose which 2 rounds will count.

The 9 Hole Golf Club is organized into a single flight. The weekly Champion is the player with the lowest net score. The weekly Champion is awarded 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 2 and 3<sup>rd</sup> place 1. The 2008 Champion will be the golfer with the highest point total.
