

He served as President of the Kaiser Aluminum Salaried Retirees Association from 2001 through 2006 and was the Chairman of the Official Retirees Committee during the 53 months that Kaiser Aluminum was in bankruptcy.

Jed met his wife Rosemary in 1959 and was married in 1962. They have six children and five grandchildren and now reside in San Ramon. Jed's sponsor was David Geary when he joined SIR in 2000 (?). His hobbies include playing golf and watching baseball.

The trio caught more than 10 keeper stripers, keeping 4 between 4 and 8 lbs. Joe Peterson on separate trips took Craig Walton, Al Brunner, and Carl Moyer and everybody caught a striper. Not as busy as the day with Terry, but several fish each day. Joe Karg took a party boat out the gate for sand dabs and crabs, catching only 15 dabs, but getting a limit of nice big crabs. Joe Karg also joined Carl Moyer and Harry Sherinian for a day of shore fishing at Shadow Cliffs reservoir. Unfortunately, the trout were not biting and the wind was ablowin. Karl Droese, Joe Karg, and Carl Moyer fished the mothball fleet out of Martinez for stur-

geon on two trips catching only 1 keeper striper, a small starry flounder, and some kingfish. Craig Walton and Joe Peterson joined Carl Moyer for some striper and crappie fishing before the water turned cold. No stripers were injured on these productions, but some crappie underwent relocations. Carl Moyer tried sturgeon fishing twice more, for a small keeper striper each trip but no sturgeon.

We have an exciting agenda for 2008, starting with a journey to the Klamath River for steelhead, a sturgeon outing in Suisun Bay, and group trips to the Fishing Expos in San Mateo and San Francisco. A shore fishing trip to the delta is going to be a different and interesting foray. We are planning a lot of local outings for next year that should be fun and informative for everybody







New Golf Things for 2008

Three new things for 2008:

You no longer have to hole all putts! If a foot or less it is a "gimmee", you may pick the ball up, add a stroke, and you are finished.

The Club Championship for the eighteen hole group will be increased from three flights to four flights. The winner will receive \$40 and the runner-up \$20 in each of the four flights. The total amount will be slightly increased with the amount awarded in each flight slightly less.

If you are a nine-hole player and don't have an NCGA number, I will be glad to calculate an exact index for you. Bob Daily and Jim Nachtweih are the folks taking me up on this free service so far. I will use the exact formula used by the NCGA. I need the date, course and tees, and gross score. Once I have 10 nine-hole scores (18 hole rounds count as two) I will be able to calculate the index. Send the results to me by e-mail each time you play, and each month I will publish the new indexes. If you have any past scores I can use them to help you get an index sooner. Golf books will be handed out the January luncheon.
