Remember the Nuclear Power Plant disaster at Fukushima in Japan? We are honored to have Dr. Mark Bandstra of UC Berkeley talk about his as-



sessment of the disaster and the radioactive measurements made after the incident.

Mark Bandstra did his undergraduate work at Harvard in High En-

ergy Physics and completed his Doctorate in the UC Berkeley Nuclear Engineering Department.

Around March 17, 2011, trace amounts of radioactive isotopes from the Fukushima plant became detectable in California air and rainwater. A group of students, faculty, and postdocs in the UC Berkeley Nuclear Engineering Department began measuring these radioisotopes in our local environment and communicating the results to the public. Mark will discuss both the results of their measurements and the related public outreach effort, especially the concerns and misperceptions they heard from the public and how they responded.
