

# Receiving Hardcopies of the Newsletter

In January, the Trampas Topics printing and mailing cost substantially increased due to a couple changes by the USPS and it forced the Branch Executive Committee (BEC) to re-evaluate the hard-copy distribution of our newsletter. At the January 21st meeting, the BEC decided that hardcopy newsletter distribution via USMail will no longer be subsidized by the Branch. Starting with the February newsletter, there will be three ways for individuals to get the newsletter. They will be:

- Electronically via the Internet (www.branch116.org/trampas/).
- 2. Via a buddy or family member with Internet access who will print it for you.
- 3. Mailed hardcopies will be available but only if you pay an annual \$20 printing/mailing cost.

We have looked a various alternatives for reducing the cost of the newsletter by going to different printers and by hand folding, labeling & mailing them ourselves using volunteers and, by manually processing newsletter distribution, we were able to get the cost down to \$1.62/each (\$20/year). Because this does require some handwork via volunteers, we prefer to minimize the number of hard-copies to be mailed out so we encourage everyone to use options 1 & 2 above if at all possible.

It is important for everyone to checkout each and every newsletter for information on what is happening in our Branch. If you want to receive a hardcopy of the newsletter mailed to you, please send a \$20 check to our Treasurer John Peterson (1001 Millbrook Court, Walnut Creek 94598) or bring a check to our February Luncheon.


The duplicate group did not meet in January because the normal date fell on New Year's day..
