The team of Jim Nachtweih/Milt Greenstein were the top team with 84.00 points out of a possible 135, for 62.22%, and earning 1.20 master points. In 2nd place were Marv DeHues/Norm Schoenfeld with 59.26%, followed by Jack Butler/Dimitris Argyriou at 58.15%, Dick Chaffee/Fred Cochran at 55.56% and Ernie Sherne / Ed Mein with 53.33%.

The lunch/bridge group met on January 14th with 27 men attending. Our high scorer was Jerry Christopherson with 6,210 points, followed by Bob Kahl with 5,010, Art Donaldson at 4,610, Bob Wolf at 4,440 and Ali Aghaiepour with 4,210. We had four small slam made today by Jerry Christopherson with Jack Butler for his first small slam and the floating dummy for his second one. The other two small slams were made by the teams of Jon Dickson/Dennis Snarr and Lou Sandor/Ali Aghaiepour. Overall, today was a low scoring day, with the average score for a round of 520 points, way below our average lately of over 600.

We also awarded our yearly "CERTIFICATE OF ACHEIVEMENT" to our 2013 Bridge Champion, BOB KAHL, for the highest average score for the year.



Built into our dinner costs are approximately 29% of the overall cost which applies to Tax & gratuity. One of the smaller costs are for the food. Bar income makes up a good portion of the profit for most restaurants.

Your Dine-O-Sir committee strives to negotiate a reasonable all-in price that enables our SIR group to have a quality attractive menu and a good social setting. It is difficult to meet every bodies taste and desires, but we try to do our best. We welcome any suggestions you may have.

The Dine-O-Sir will be out to pasture in February but we are working on our next event which will take place in March, 2104. Stay tuned ------
