

Many others have fished Shadow Cliffs and Lafayette Reservoir catching 2 fewer fish. We have hope for the recent opening of San Pablo Reservoir, but it is poor after a rain, and we are finally getting just enough rain to muddy it. The lack of rain is going to make this a very challenging year for fishing. Many of the reservoirs are at record low levels and launching boats will be difficult if not impossible. Even our local haunt, Shadow Cliffs in Pleasanton is so low that some of our fisherman cannot launch their boats.

We will be very busy this spring with: delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon; trout in mountain and local lakes. 
