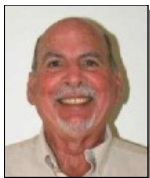

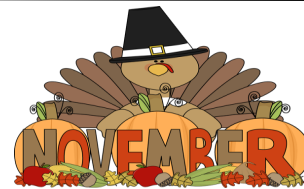
What I did on My Summer Vacation - Continued

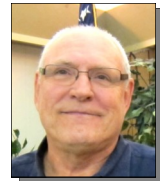

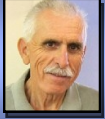
