



Three area branches of SIR are promoting a Theatre Party for an award-winning play by Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright Eugene O’Neill at Danville’s Tao House.

A Moon for the Misbegotten will be staged in the Old Barn at the Eugene O’Neill National Historic Site in the hills above Danville on Sunday, September 25 for a matinée at 2:00 p.m.


Members of SIR Branch 116, Branch 128, and Branch 146 have joined together for this event. A special discount is available for members and guests of these SIR Branches.

Tickets are \$60 available on the Eugene O’Neill Foundation’s website. We are being offered a limited number of \$5 discount for members of the three SIR Branches at <https://eugeneoneill.org/event/a-moon-for-the-misbegotten-sirs-preferred-access/>. Information for access to the National Historic Site is available on the website eugeneoneill.org.

O’Neill is America’s only Nobel Prize-winning playwright. He lived in the hills above Danville from 1936-1944. “A Moon for the Misbegotten” was written during this period, and is perhaps O’Neill’s most popular play. The play has been presented frequently across the country, and on five occasions on Broadway since its debut in 1947.

In addition, a concert of traditional and contemporary Irish music at the Veterans Memorial Building in Danville will be the kickoff event of the 23rd Annual Eugene O’Neill Festival. The concert celebrates the Friendship City relationship between Danville and New Ross, Ireland, from which O’Neill’s father James emigrated. Acclaimed Bay Area musicians Cormac Gannon, Erin Thompson, and Steve Gardner will vocalize and play a variety of instruments, including the fiddle and uilleann pipes. 




Golf Clinic
