Book Club 2 met Thursday, November 21 to discuss Hamnet, by Maggie O'Farrell. The group voted the book 4.6/5. A brief summary below:

HAMNET

Drawing on Maggie O'Farrell's long-term fascination with the little-known story behind Shakespeare's most enigmatic play, Hamnet is a luminous portrait of a marriage, at its heart the loss of a beloved child.

Warwickshire in the 1580s. Agnes, William Shakespeare's wife, is a woman as feared as she is sought after for her unusual gifts. Agnes settles with her husband, William, on Henley Street, Stratford-on-Avon, and has three children: a daughter, Susanna, and twins, Hamnet and Judith. The boy, Hamnet, dies in 1596, aged eleven. Four years or so later, Shakespeare writes a play called

Hamlet.

Award-winning author Maggie O'Farrell's novel breathes full-blooded life into the story of a loss usually consigned to literary footnotes, and provides an unforgettable vindication of Agnes, a woman intriguingly absent from history.

- Monday, February 24... "Isaac's Storm" by Eric Larson

Book Group #1 met on Monday November 25, 2024 at Orinda Books to discuss "James" by Percival Everett, a reimagining of the adventures of N.... Jim from Mark Twain's Huckelberry Finn. On one level this is a quest by the protagonist to flee slavery, reunite with his wife and daughter and finally flee to the free state Iowa. On another it is a description of the psychological and physical pain of slavery. On

still a third, it illustrates the language of subjugation for both slave and slave holder. Various incidents in the book play off the characters and situations from Huckleberry Finn. The very different messages and nuances which the author gave these situations added much weight to our discussion.

Paul Freitas introduced the book while Richard Black led the discussion with John Riordan, Garrett Girvan, Peter Loew, Mac McLoughlan, Mike Schneider, Brad Stribling, Tim Tinnes, Steve Bort, Art Donaldson, Jim Flesner and Joel White. Book Club #1 awarded the book 3.8 stars for this novel which explored complex issues around 19th century life which continue to resonate.

Book Group #1 will not meet until January of 2025. Happy Holidays and we shall resume in 2025.


