## **Branch Executive Committee (BEC) Minutes - Summary**

Meeting of October 21,, 2024

- Financial: Branch cash balance as of 10-1-24 is \$9,893.34. Reserve balance is \$12,201.22. A proposed 2025 budget was presented by Treasurer Charlie Guthrie and discussed by BEC membership. The budget will be voted on for approval at the November meeting.
- Luncheon Attendance: 102 lunches were paid. The three menu choices for lunch were Crispy Chicken Costaletta, Herb Roasted Cod, and Spinach Ricotta Stuffed Manicotti. The October luncheon was a free lunch for all past Big Sir's. Branches 8, 116 and 146 are meeting with Boundary Oak staff discussing various luncheon options in an attempt to make the luncheon monthly a more satisfying experience.
- Free Lunch: A motion was made and unanimously passed that members 100 years and older will receive a free lunch for every luncheon they attend.
- Membership: Current active membership is 190.
- Activities: 22 activities are currently operating resulting in 30 activity days. A new activity, Computer Tech, started this month.
- Holiday Party: The date of this year's Holiday Party is December 17th at Boundary Oak. A four-person committee has been formed to organize the evening's festivities.

Lawrence was raised in Southern California, received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Radio/ Television/Film from California State University, Long Beach, and his Juris Doctor degree from Washington & Lee University and School of Law, Lexington, Virginia. He is a member of the State Bars in Colorado, Wyoming, Virginia and West Virginia.

The reporter of Decisions is responsible for supervising the preparation of more than 12,000 California Supreme Court and Court of Appeal opinions each year. Appointed by the court, the Reporter ensures the editorial integrity of all opinions from filing through publication and posting of the them.

# Book Group 2 Scott Clark

Book Club 2 met October 17 to discuss <u>The Ministry of Time</u> by Kaliane Bradley. The group voted the book 2.8/5.

A few in our group who like literary fiction were the only fans of this book. Most members felt the the back third of the book really dragged. On line reviews echoed this opinion.

#### The Ministry of Time, by Kaliane Bradley

In the near future, a civil servant is offered the salary of her dreams and is, shortly afterward, told what project she'll be working on. A recently established government ministry is gathering "expats" from across history to establish whether time travel is feasible--for the body, but also for the fabric of space-time. She is tasked with working as a "bridge": living with, assisting, and monitoring the expat known as "1847" or Commander Graham Gore. As far as history is concerned, Commander Gore died on Sir John Franklin's doomed 1845 expedition to the Arctic, so he's a little disoriented to be living with an unmarried woman who regularly shows her calves, surrounded by outlandish concepts such as "washing machines," "Spotify," and "the collapse of the British Empire." But with an appetite for discovery, a seven-a-day cigarette habit, and the support of a charming and chaotic cast of fellow expats, he soon adjusts. Over the next year, what the

bridge initially thought would be, at best, a horrifically uncomfortable roommate dynamic, evolves into something much deeper. By the time the true shape of the Ministry's project comes to light, the bridge has fallen haphazardly, fervently in love, with consequences she never could have imagined. Forced to confront the choices that brought them together, the bridge must finally reckon with how--and whether she believes--what she does next can change the future. An original and fun fusion of genres and ideas, The Ministry of Time asks: What does it mean to defy history, when history is living in your house? Kaliane Bradley's answer is a testament to what we owe each other in a changing world.

# Book Group 1 Rich Black

Book Group #1 will discuss the following books at Orinda Books at 10:15 am on the following dates:

- Monday, November 25... "James" by Percival Everett
- Monday, January 6 ... "The Emerald Mile" by Kevin Fedarko
- Monday, January 27 ... "The Frozen River" by Ariel Lawhon

Book Group #1 met on Monday October 28, 2024 in the gazebo of the Orinda Park to discuss the "The Women" by Kristin Hannah, a fictional account of an Army combat nurse in Viet Nam from 1967 through 1969 and her subsequent struggle with alcohol, drugs, and PTSD. Upon her return to America, she found a nation which denied there were women in Viet Nam and was often hostile to all who served.
